In keeping with its mission, AISWN continues to advance the goal of promote a network for supporting women scholars in information systems and to enable mentorship relationships that are crucial to speed the success of women in the information systems field. Our membership roster has over 185 AIS members The AISWN has worked with AIS to integrate membership and setting up the website connections to AIS. AISWN members represent academic (faculty and doctoral students) and a variety of industry and service sectors. The membership has a global impact representing over 30 countries and six continents. We have both a LinkedIn (344 members) and Facebook (73 members) presence since 2011. We have a discussion listserv on AIS groups with 172 members currently.

Specifically, in 2016 the AISWN supported the offering of a Childcare at AMCIS 2016. Though there were not a sufficient amount of attendees, who signed up for the service, it was believed that a longer lead time might improve the numbers in future offerings.

Call from ISJ Editors-in-Chief for Greater Participation of Women in the Journal

I am reaching out to members of the AIS Women's Network to solicit participation in *Information Systems Journal*. When the founding editors-in-chief, David Avison and Guy Fitzgerald, retired in 2012 I became one of the three new editors-in-chief. In addition to maintaining the high standards of this AIS basket of 8 journal, another mission has been to increase the diversity of the journal. We have been pursuing this mission in several ways. We three editors represent the three AIS regions (Eileen Trauth – North/South America; Robert Davison – Asia/Pacific; Philip Powell – Europe/Africa) so as to increase the geographical diversity of journal participation. We have also clarified in our inaugural editorial (July 2012) that while the motivation to start the journal was to provide a publication outlet for qualitative work, we have broadened our mission. We welcome research that employs all methodologies and epistemologies. Finally, we are interested in increasing the gender diversity of ISJ. This means increasing the number of women who serve on our editorial advisory board, the number of women who serve as senior and associate editors, the number of women who serve as reviewers, and the number of women who publish in ISJ. Please consider becoming involved with ISJ in one of the following ways:

We are currently reconstituting the editorial advisory board. The role of this board is to give us advice on strategic directions for the journal, to encourage submissions, to recommend special issues, and to occasionally review papers. Members of this board are typically full professors or senior associate professors. If you are interested please send me an email along with a link to your CV.

We would also like to increase the number of women in the peer review pipeline. You could begin by becoming an ISJ reviewer. The next step would be associate editor. After some experience, when a position opens you could become a senior editor. If you are interested in one of these roles please send me a link to your CV and a brief statement of your research expertise that includes the topics of your research and the methodologies/epistemologies you employ.

Please consider submitting manuscripts to ISJ. Because we publish six issues a year there is not an overly long time lag from submission to publication. If you are not familiar with *Information Systems Journal* I encourage you to read the July 2012 editorial.
