The School of Interdisciplinary Informatics at the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO) invites applications for two tenure-track positions at the rank of Assistant Professor. Successful candidates will have completed a doctoral degree in Information Systems, Computer Science, Information Technology, Industrial Design, or related disciplines and have a strong potential to generate external research and development grants and engage in teaching. The School is particularly interested in candidates with innovation experience. Candidates with a major field of study in Innovation, Design Thinking, Creativity, Product Development and Design, Computer Supported Cooperative Work, Collaboration Technologies, or related fields are strongly encouraged to apply.

In addition to the School of Interdisciplinary Informatics, the College of Information Science and Technology (IS&T) has two other units –the Department of Information Systems and Quantitative Analysis and the Department of Computer Science. The College of IS&T is an interdisciplinary college focusing on meeting the needs of a vibrant metropolitan area. The academic program portfolio of the college includes five undergraduate degree programs (Computer Science, Management Information Systems, Bioinformatics, Information Assurance, IT Innovation) and four Master of Science degree programs (Computer Science, Management Information Systems, Information Assurance, Biomedical Informatics). The college also hosts two innovative PhD programs in Information Technology and Biomedical Informatics. The college of IS&T has around 1200 students with roughly 800 undergraduates.

The College of IS&T has nearly 60 full-time tenure track faculty/staff and an active research grants portfolio of \$10 million with funds from federal agencies (e.g., NSF, NIH, DHS, DoD, Dept of Ed, NASA), state government (e.g., NRI, NSF EPSCoR, NU Foundation) and from a number of local and national agencies. The College of IS&T and the College of Engineering and Technology from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln are partners in The Peter Kiewit Institute of Information Science, Technology and Engineering, which offers further opportunity for interdisciplinary work and engagement with the community. The College is also a sponsor in the university-wide Center for Collaboration Science, which promotes research and practice in collaboration by partnering across academia and industry and the home of the NSA/DHS National CAE in IA/CD designated Nebraska University Center for Information Assurance (NUCIA).
